Call to Confession

Confession and lament are both a healthy orientation to reality. As a community, our corporate lament and confession of sin is a three-fold acknowledgement that the world is not the way it was meant to be; I am not the way I was meant to be; and we as a church are not the way we were meant to be. As we acknowledge our failures together, we testify to the world that the gospel is rooted not in our performance, but in the faithful mercy of God.

I These are the generations of the sons of Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Sons were born to them after the flood.

Benediction

If the Call to Worship is one bookend, communicating to us that God has the first word, the benediction is its match, reminding us that He has the final word as well. The words of benediction (a Latin word meaning "to speak well" or "to speak a good word") are intended to bring a blessing. Rather than the worship service ending with a command or merely a "see you next week", a blessing reminds us of the beauty of God's promise to be not only with us when we gather, but also when we scatter.
